EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S LETTER



Jewish Free Loan is an organization created by the Jewish community, for the Arizona Jewish community. We are here to provide interest-free loans for our neighbors facing unimaginable immediate challenges like pending eviction or burial expenses for a loved one. And we're also here for families seeking loans to pay for infertility treatment, home access modifications and vehicle repairs. Interest-free lending helps provide a pathway to future financial security.

Interest-free lending is possible because our donors and partners entrust the JFL Board of Directors and our professional team to be responsible stewards of their contributions. And that

generosity means that people facing life's challenges have a trusted resource to turn to during difficult times. During our most recent fiscal year, we had several notable accomplishments as we furthered our 73-year mission of providing interest-free loans to Arizona's Jewish community. From June 1, 2022—May 31, 2023, JFL:

- **Distributed** \$767,772 in interest-free loans our largest single-year distribution to date.
- **Proactively created and successfully implemented** the Eviction Prevention Loan Program, distributing \$44,570 to prevent loss of housing and laying the foundation for an important ongoing resource as eviction rates continue to rise.
- Navigated changes in the economic environment, which increased demand for financial
 assistance, while decreasing the ability of many current loan borrowers to make regular
 payments on their loans, impacting our available loan dollars.
- Maximized the technological advances adopted during COVID to support our move to the Ina Levine Jewish Community Campus, enabling JFL to enjoy our new home in a safe, communal space while maintaining the highest levels of client confidentiality.



ENSURING SAFE HOUSING

JFL launched its Eviction Prevention Program to help Jewish individuals and families stay safe amidst the current housing crisis. Through JFL's Eviction Prevention Program, applicants may be eligible for an interest-free loan of up to \$5,000 to help avoid displacement. In addition, JFL provides emergency and traditional loans to ensure safe housing needs are met.
